





Revenue: Demand compared with FY 2019 was down by 5.33%. Revenue dollars are approximately 1% higher than this time last year due to the May 2019 rate increase. The reduced consumption could have been the result of the decrease in average temperatures this past summer that continued into the fall. We will be monitoring the effect that the Stay Home/Save Lives order has on consumption. We may see higher usage on residential and lower usage on the commercial side. This will become more evident after the April and May billing cycles.

Expenses – Personnel Services expense dollars are significantly higher than prior years due to the payment of budgeted PERS Transitional Liability. Exclusive of the PERS Transitional Liability payment, personnel services are 36.25% of the biennial budget without the budgeted PERS payment. Materials & Services are at 31.8% of the biennial budget under the 37.5% of the two-year budget cycle or \$529,000 under budget

Residential Customers are billed on the even months, Commercial Customers are billed on the odd months.






Regulatory

All 84 samples collected and analyzed for the April monitoring period showed no presence of coliform/*E. coli* bacteria.

Quarterly Disinfection By-Product sampling was conducted at 4 locations in the North Service Area and 4 locations in the South Service Area distribution systems.

Non-Regulatory

General water quality parameters (pH, temperature, chlorine, TDS) were collected for the distribution system at 16 locations in the North and South systems.

Monthly watershed sampling was conducted at 4 long-term sampling locations for total organic carbon, nutrients (nitrate/nitrite, total phosphorus, orthophosphate, etc.), coliform density, pH, dissolved oxygen, TDS, temperature, and volatile organic carbon compounds (VOCs, 21 regulated for drinking water, 36 unregulated). Raw water at our intakes was also tested for giardia and cryptosporidium, as we do each month.

Quarterly sampling was conducted in raw water at the treatment plant intakes for inorganic compounds, including metals, synthetic inorganic chemicals (SIOCs, 29 regulated for drinking water, 5 unregulated), and synthetic organic chemicals (SOCs, 29 regulated, 14 unregulated).

Sampling for Other Agencies

All 50 samples collected and analyzed during this period for Sunrise Water Authority showed no presence of coliform/*E.coli* bacteria.

Winter Conditions Report as of May 4, 2020

Current Oregon statewide snow water equivalent is 64 percent of normal. (See graphic below)

Current Oregon statewide precipitation at NRCS SNOTEL sites is well below average at 78 percent for the water year.

Over the next 8 to 14 days, the NOAA Climate Prediction Center is a higher than normal probability of above-normal temperature and above-normal precipitation across the state.
