# Agenda Item 2.0 Consider Construction Contract Award for Water Treatment Plant (WTP) Concrete Repairs and Seismic Bracing, Project 23-5309

Mr. Bjornstedt shared with the Board that this project is a budgeted project in the BN 23-25. This project is a portion of the work under the larger structural project and is being timed to be completed while the WTP is shut down for the filter valve replacement project beginning late March. This project cost is being presented to the Board as a not to exceed amount as the costs may change once the contractor gets in to start the work so this is an educated estimate of the project cost.

Commissioner Rubitschun asked if the work would be done in multiple phases for costing but the project is set up more by area. Commissioner Garrison asked about the type of concrete work (some shoring up basin walls and some work will be to install new concrete). Commissioner Angier asked if the project addressed seismic issues, some would but that is not the focus of this project.

#### Agenda Item 3.0 Management Report

- The Board received the monthly report and the report is posted on the CRW website.
- WTP Filter Replacement Project- this project will have the treatment plant shutdown for 7 weeks. Staff have been preparing and strategizing to prepare for this and conducted a 6 hour test to be sure of how water could be moved through the interties with no water from the CRW plant. All materials are on site and the project will begin on March 20. The shutdown is an opportunity to tackle projects around the WTP that will be more easily taken care of without the plant running. Staff have also been coordinating with regional partners with success.
- Riverside Park- The Clackamas Little opening day is April 6, CRW Board and staff have been invited to attend
- CRW has now had two years in a row with zero accidents, this ensures staff go home safely, there will be savings to the district for workers compensation premiums
- There will be a March 25 Work Session focusing on rates
- Actively recruiting for a CFO and a Sr. Waterworks mechanic. Two resignations, one as a water treatment specialist and a customer service specialist. Have hired an accountant, WTP Supervisor, and payroll specialist.

#### Regulatory

All 73 samples collected and analyzed for the February monitoring period showed no presence of coliform/E. coli bacteria.


In February we began sampling for the Fifth Unregulated Contaminant Monitoring Rule (UCMR5) in both our North and South systems. Sampling will occur quarterly during the calendar year 2024 and focuses on unregulated PFAS compounds. There were none detected in the February samples.

#### **Non-Regulatory**

General water quality parameters (pH, temperature, chlorine, TDS, hardness, alkalinity) were collected throughout the distribution system at 19 locations in the North and South systems.


Monthly watershed sampling was conducted at 4 long-term sampling locations for total organic carbon, nutrients (nitrate/nitrite, total phosphorus, orthophosphate, etc), VOCs (Volatile Organic Chemicals), coliform density, pH, dissolved oxygen, TDS, and temperature.

- As of March 05, 2024, the Willamette basin snowpack was 118% of median.
- February **precipitation in the Clackamas basin was 117% of normal.** Precipitation since the beginning of the water year (October 1 March 4) has been 109% of normal.
- The three-month outlook (Mar-May) from the NOAA Climate Prediction Center shows a high likelihood of above normal temperatures for Oregon, and a slightly elevated chance of below normal precipitation.
